On planet earth there are lots of different types of plants and animals. Even the small things, like insects and plants, are very important for our environment!






# INSECTS

There are lots of different species of insects.


Even though they are so small, insects are the most abundant living things on the earth!



2. They grow a little bigger into a larvae.






